Punjab State Civil Services Combined Competitive Examination-2025

1. Introduction

1.1 The Punjab Public Service Commission (PPSC) has been established under Article 315 of the Constitution of India, with the basic purpose of recruating officials in various departments of the Government as per the requisitions sent by the Government in this regard from time to time

1.2 The Punjab State Civil Services Combined Competitive Examination-2025 (PSCSCCE-2025) is being conducted by the PPSC for recruitment of officers as Punjab Civil Service (Executive Branch), Deputy Superintendent of Police, Tehnildar, Food and Civil Supply Officer, Block Development & Panchayat Officer, Assistant Registrar Co-Operative Societies, Labour-cum-Conciliation Officer, Employment Generation, Skill Development and Training Officer, Excise & Taxation Officer (ETO) and Deputy Superintendent of Jasls (Grade-II) District Probation Officer. After completion of the examination process, the Commission shall send a list of the successful candidates to the Government. This Advertisement is being published as per the requisition received from the Government of Punjab, Dept. of Personnel vide letter No.10/04/21-5PP3/647 dated: 25/11/2024 and letter No.10/04/21-5PP3/02 dated. 02/01/2025.

1.3 The Preliminary Combined Competitive Examination-2025 is tentatively scheduled for April 2025. Exact date for the Preliminary examination shall be intimated later on.

- The number of posts may be increased or decreased by the Government at any time before the selection process is complete without giving any prior notice to the candidates.
- The Punjab Civil Services (Reservation of posts for women) Rules 2020 issued by Note 2 the Department of Social Security and Women and Child Development provide for 33% reservation for women of Punjab. These Rules are attuched as Annexure-I with General Information for candidates.
- Candidates who apply under sports category should have gradation certificate as per Government of Punjah, Department of Personnel (Personnel Policies-I Branch) Notification No. GSR 40/Const/Art.309/Amd.(2)/2020 dated 20/07/2020 (Annexure II) issued by the competent authority. The candidature of the candidates who are found ineligible at any stage of the recruitment process for not possessing requisite documents i.e. sports gradation certificate as per latest notification, etc. will be rejected and such candidates WILL NOT EVEN BE CONSIDERED IN THEIR BASIC CATEGORY.
 - Sports Gradation Certificate of School Level/University Level/District Level 3. 3) shall not be considered as per Punjab Govt. Notification dated 20/07/2020 (Annexure II) and as per clarification received from the Department of Sports, Punjab vide letter dated 10/05/2022 National Level Women Festival/National

Women Championship/ All India Inter Zonal League National Softball Championship (Men/Women) certificate shall not be considered.

- Note 4 Only those persons with "Benchmark disabilities" would be eligible for reservation in the Persons with Disability category. According to Section 2 (r) of The Rights of Person with Disabilities Act, 2016, "Person with Benchmark disability" means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability. The scrutiny of documents i.e. disability certificates (not less than 40% disability), Punjab domicile certificate etc. of the candidates of PwD category who apply for scribe will be conducted before the competitive examination. The candidature of the candidates who are found ineligible for not possessing requisite documents will be rejected and such candidates will not even be considered in their basic category.

 Note 5 The candidates are advised to select their category carefully and with due diligence, as the category once selected by a candidate will not be changed under any circumstances and if found ineligible under that category will have their

Note: The candidates must fill the order of preference for services posts in the Application Form for the Main Competitive Exam. The choice indicated by the candidate would be final unless changed before the final result becomes available.

Educational Qualifications

- 3.1 The candidate should possess a bachelor degree in any discipline from a recognised university or institution; Provided that the candidate may be permitted to take preliminary examination while studying for the qualifying degree. However, the candidate shall be required to produce proof of passing the degree course for being eligible to take the Main Competitive Examination.
 3.2 No candidate shall be eligible for appearing in the Preliminary Competitive Examination, unless he she
- 3.2 No candidate shall be eligible for appearing in the Preliminary Competitive Examination, unless he she has passed the Matriculation Examination with Punjabi as one of the compulsory or elective subjects or any other equivalent examination in Punjabi language, which may be specified by the Government from time to time.

3.3 For the purpose of eligibility for PSCSCCE-2025, the expression 'recognised university' or "institution" shall have the same meaning, as assigned to it in the Punjab Civil Services (General and Common Conditions of Service) Rules, 1994.

Provided further that where a ward of Defence Service Personnel, who is a bonafide resident of Punjab State, is appointed by direct appointment, he shall have to pass an examination of Punjabi Language equivalent to Matriculation Standard or he shall have to qualify a test conducted by the Language Wing of the Department of Education of Punjab Government within a period of two years from the date of his appointment.

Provided further that where a War Hero, who has been discharged from defence services or paramilitary forces on account of disability suffered by him and his widow or dependent member of his family, is appointed under the instructions assued in this behalf by the Government, the person so appointed will not be required to possess aforesaid knowledge of Punjabi language:

4 Age Limit

- 4.1 As mandated by Punjab State Civil Services (Appointment by Combined Competitive Examination) Rules, 2009 read with Punjab Civil Services (Executive Branch) Rules 1976, and Govt. instructions issued from time to time, the candidate should have attained the minimum age of 21 years and should not have attained the age of 37 years on the first day of January of the year in which the last day for submission of application to the Commission falls. In other words, the candidate should have attained the age of 21 years but should not be older than 37 years on 1° January 2025.
- 4.2 The Upper age limit may be relaxed up to 42 years for Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes of Punjab only in case of other services except Punjab Police Service and Punjab Prisons Service (Read 4.8)
- 4.3 Upper age limit may be relaxed up to 45 years for Punjab Govt. and its Board Corporation Commission and Authorities employees, all States/ Central Government employees. However no age relaxation is permissible for Punjab Police Service only.
- 4.4 Ex-servicemen of Punjab Domicile shall be allowed to deduct the period of his service in the Armed Forces of Union from his actual age and if the resultant age does not exceed the maximum age limit prescribed for direct appointment to such a vacancy in the Service Rules concerned by more than three years, he shall be deemed to satisfy the condition regarding age limit.
- 4.5 Upper age limit may be relaxed up to 42 years for Widows, Divorced women and certain other Categories of women. However no age relaxation is permissible for women in case of Punjab Police Service and Punjab Prisons Service.
- 4.6 Upper age limit may be relaxed up to 47 years for Physically Handicapped of Punjab only. However no age relaxation is permissible in case of Punjab Police Service and Punjab Prisons Services.
- 4.7 In the case of the post of Deputy Superintendent Police and Deputy Superintendent Jails (Grade-II) /District Probation Officer in Punjab Police Service and Punjab Prisons Service, a candidate abould have attained the minimum age of 21 years and should not have attained the age of 28 years on the first day of the year, as referred to above.
- 4.8 The Upper age limit may be relaxed up to 33 years for Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes of Punjab only in case of Punjab Police Service and Punjab Prisons Service.

NOTE: The minimum pay admissible for the ibid posts shall be as per the notification of Finance department dated 05/12/2020 (APPENDIX -I) and as per Notification No. 7/204/2012-4FPI/66, Dated 15/01/2015 Govt. of Punjab, Department of Finance (Finance Personnel-I Branch) Chandigarh, and Notification No. 1/62016-4P.P.1/834680/1 dated 07/09/2016 Govt. of Punjab, Department of

Personnel PP-I Branch Chandigarh, fixed emolument equal to Minimum Pay without any allowance will be paid during the probution period of 3 years.

Scheme of PSCSCCE-2025

- 5.1 The candidates who apply in response to the advertisement for these posts will be registered by filling Online Application Form, a link of which is available on the website of the Commission http://ppsc.gov.in
- 5.2 The scrutiny of application forms shall be done after the conduct of the Mains examination. During the process of scrutiny, the application forms and other relevant documents, certificates, etc of the candidates shall be examined to determine their eligibility. Candidates not meeting the eligibility criteria will be rejected after the scrutiny process or any time thereafter if found ineligible. The candidates of the candidate shall be provisional till the time of verification of documents of the candidate at the time of interview, when the candidate shall produce his/her original certificates for verification by the Commission.
- 5.5 Candidates may apply for the PSCSCCE-2025 ONLY by filling the Online Application Form (OAF).
- 5.4 If any document certificate statement of the candidate is found false or forged, his/her candidature may be rejected and further action will be taken as per law.
- 5.5 Essential steps involved in the selection process are:
 - i) Preliminary Competitive Examination; and
 - Main Competitive Examination (written and Interview).

A) Procedure and scheme for the Preliminary Examination:

The preliminary competitive examination will consist of two papers of 200 marks each and shall comprise of objective type (multiple choice) questions. The detail is as follows:-

Note:

- 1) Both the papers will be of objective type multiple choice questions.
- 1(a) CSAT Exam shall be of qualifying nature, without negative marking with the minimum cut off of 40 % marks.

EXPLANATION:

- (i) Candidates must secure atleast 40 % marks in Paper-II (Civil Services Aptitude Test) to qualify the Preliminary Examination and these Paper-II (Civil Services Aptitude Test) marks will not be counted for the determination of merit of the Preliminary exam.
- (ii) The merit of the Preliminary Examination shall be solely based Paper -I (General Studies).
- Duration of each paper for preliminary examination will be two hours. However, Persons
 with disability candidates will be given additional 40 minutes for each paper.
- 3) There will be no negative marking in the written preliminary examination test.
- 4) The question paper shall be bilingual and shall be printed in English (Roman script) and Punjabi (Gurumukhi script) except for questions where candidates' proficiency in language is to be tested.
- 5) Details of syllabi are indicated in Appendix-II. (Attached)
- 6) The standard of questions would be to test the knowledge as is expected of a person who has attained education at least up to graduation level.
- 7) Preliminary Examination is only a screening test for selecting candidates who would be eligible to take the Main Examination and the marks obtained in this Examination shall

- not be counted towards the merit of the candidates arrived at after the Written Main Examination.
- 8) Candidates equal to 12 to 13 times of the vacancies advertised in each category would qualify from amongst those appearing in the Preliminary Examination for the Main Examination, provided that, such number of candidates are available and, are otherwise eligible for admission to the Main Examination.

NOTE:-

IN THE GENERAL STUDIES SYLLABUS SPECIAL EMPHASIS ON HISTORY, CULTURE, ECONOMY AND GEOGRAPHY OF PUNJAB IS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE MAIN EXAMINATION.

- 1 All papers shall be descriptive in nature and duration of each paper will be three hours. Visually impaired candidates will, however, be allowed an extra time of sixty minutes in each paper.
- 2 The main competitive examination shall include seven compulsory papers.
- 3 Candidates will have the option to attempt all the papers, except the language papers in Punjabi or English medium.
- 4 Candidates exercising the option to answer Papers in Punjabi language may, if they so desire, give English version within brackets of only the description of the technical terms, if any, in addition to the version in Punjabi language.
- 5 The question papers other than language papers will be set in English. However, when any candidate opts for attempting any paper(s) in Punjabi medium, the question papers shall be printed in Punjabi accordingly.
- 6 Details of syllabi are indicated in Appendix-III. (Attached).
- 7 Interview shall be conducted for only those candidates who qualify on the basis of their performance in the main competitive examination and who fulfill the criteria of eligibility.
- No candidate shall be eligible to appear in the interview unless he'she obtains 45% marks in the aggregate of all the papers (read 40 % for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) including at least 25% marks in each paper provided that if in any main competitive examination, a sufficient number of candidates do not obtain 45% marks in the aggregate (read 40 % for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes), the Commission may at their discretion lower this percentage to not below 40% (read 35 % for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes), however, the minimum percentage for each paper shall remain unchanged.
- 9 No candidate shall be considered to have qualified the competitive examination unless he obtains at least 45% marks in the aggregate in the main examination including interview marks (read 40 % for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) except in the case of any main competitive examination for which this percentage has been lowered to not less than 40% (read 35 % for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) by the Commission in which case the qualifying percentage shall be as determined by the Commission.
- 10. From amongst the candidates who have appeared for the Main written examination, candidates

not more than three times the number of vacancies advertised in each category shall be called for the interview, provided that, such number of candidates are available and, are otherwise eligible for the Interview.

11 Names of qualified candidates shall be arranged in order of ment according to the aggregate marks obtained in the main written examination and the interview.

Note: In the event that the aggregate marks obtained in the Written and Interview parts of the Main Examination taken together of two or more candidates are equal, the candidate securing higher marks in the written part of the Main Examination shall be ranked higher. Should the marks in the written part of the Main Examination of such candidates are still equal, the candidate securing higher marks in the aggregate of the General Studies papers in the written part of the Main Examination shall rank higher. Should those also be equal, the candidate older in age shall rank higher. (aggregate of general study paper-II, paper-III and paper-IV)

6. HOW TO APPLY FOR PSCSCCE-2025:

6.1 The candidates can ONLY apply by filling Online Application Form, a link of which is available on the website of the Commission http://ppac.gov.in. No other mode of application will be accepted.

- 6.2 Candidates are advised to fill their details in the online application form carefully e.g., Name, Father's Name, Date of Birth, Category for post, Qualification, Experience, Photo and Signature, Category for fee, etc. After the final submission of online application form by the candidate, NO CHANGE WILL BE ALLOWED, and the candidate will be responsible for any mistake in the data filled in the online application form. CATEGORY ONCE SELECTED BY A CANDIDATE WILL NOT BE CHANGED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 6.3 Submission of printed copy of the application form: The candidates are NOT REQUIRED to send the hard copy of the Online Application Form to the Office of Punjab Public Service Commission. However, the candidates must take copy in soft form or the print out of the Application Form at the time of applying, as he/she will not be able to take out the copy at a later stage. He/she must retain the hard/soft copy of online application form along with all eligibility documents ready to be sent at a short notice to PPSC, whenever required by PPSC.
- 6.4 However, only those candidates who apply for scribe under the "Persons with Disabilities" category must submit the hardcopies of 'Online Application Form' along with Disability Certificate issued by the competent authority by post or by email at pespwd2025@gmail.com or by hand at the reception counter of PPSC by 31.01.2025. It is reiterated that persons with "Benchmark disabilities" would be eligible for reservation in the PwD Category. According to Section 2 (r) of The Rights of Person with Disabilities Act, 2016, "Person with Benchmark disability" means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability. The candidature of the candidates who do not possess the disability certificate (i.e. certificate with not less than 40% of a specified disability) will be rejected for these posts. SUCH CANDIDATE WILL NOT EVEN BE CONSIDERED IN THEIR BASIC CATEGORY. - 6.5 The candidates applying under the Sports Category should carefully fill their category. The candidature of the candidates who are found ineligible i.e. those who do not possess the sports gradation certificate as per Notification No. GSR40/Const./Art.309/ Amd. (2)/2020 dated 20/07/2020 will be rejected for these

posts and SUCH CANDIDATES WILL NOT EVEN BE CONSIDERED IN THEIR BASIC CATEGORY.

- 6.6 The following SELF ATTESTED CERTIFICATES shall be submitted by candidates along with printout of online application form when asked for at short notice:
- i) Proof of Date of Birth: Certificate of Matriculation Higher Secondary
- ii) Proof of having passed Punjabi language
- iii) Relevant Degree and DMC Certificate
- Reserve Category Certificate issued by the competent authority (if applicable)
- v) Latest Punjab Residence certificate (all reserve categories) issued by competent authority.
- (vi) Experience certificate issued by competent authority (if applicable)
- vii) For ESM, certificates documents mentioning the following -
- a) Date of Enrolment
- b) Date of Release/Discharge
- c) Reason of Release' Discharge
- viii) General Economically Weaker Section, Punjab (EWS) certification valid for the full financial year, the EWS certificate of that Financial Year in which the cut-off date for that particular advertisement fall.
- ix) Certificate as proof of age relaxation claim (if applicable)
- Certificate as proof of fee concession (if applicable)
- xi) Proof of being a government employee (if applicable)
- Copy of Certificate from the concerned authority of university institution that they had passed the requisite final examination before cut-off date.

The Candidates SHALL sign the declaration on the last page of the printout of Online Application Form before submitting the same.

6.7 APPLICATION AND EXAMINATION FEE

- 6.8 The candidates entitled to fee concession/exemption MUST submit with their Application Form, a self-attested copy of the certificate certifying their claim for fee concession/exemption. Candidates who do not submit such a certificate SHALL NOT be entitled to fee concession/exemption under any circumstances.
- 6.9 Candidate should carefully fill the details in the Online Application Form and click on the "SUBMIT" button at the end of the Online Application Format. Before pressing the "SUBMIT" button, candidates are advised to verify every detail filled in the application. NO CHANGE/EDIT WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION FORM.

- 6.10 Application fee and examination fee will be accepted via online mode only. The fee is non-refundable. Guidelines for online submission of fee are given below. A copy of Guidelines is also uploaded on respective advertisement page.
- 6.11 Candidates can apply for a post in only one category. If any candidate applies for the same post in more than one category, the category in which he/she registered first will be considered and the subsequent applications will automatically stand rejected.

7. Nationality

A candidate shall be a:

- i) Citizen of India: or
- ii) Citizen of Nepal; or
- ini) Subject of Bhatan; or
- iv) Tibetan refugee who came over to India before the I^e January, 1962, with the intention of permanently settling in India; or

Managing and financing Municipal services e.g. Solid waste management, Conservation of natural resources- water, forests, etc. Pollution control, Reviving a loss making PSU, Planning and target achievement, Gender sensitization and women empowerment, Empowerment of vulnerable sections of the society, Improving Education and Enhancing Skill development, Urban settlement-Slums and Housing issues, Managing Issues related to Urban Rural drinking water supply and sanitation, etc.

Note: A duly structured situation will be presented to the candidates and they will be asked to analyze and suggest their own solution to the problem arising out of situation.

14. Definition Of Categories

Candidates should select their categories carefully, because candidates belonging to categories other than category 71 (General), are entitled to fee concession exemption, age relaxation and job reservation. The category once selected by a candidate will not be changed under any circumstances. Candidates shall submit certificates issued by the Competent Authority in support of their claim to a particular category.

15.1 BACKWARD CLASSES (PUNJAB)

- 15.1.1 The candidates desiring to be considered for the Backward Classes category are required to submit a certificate as per Punjab Government letter No. 1/41/93. RCI/459 dated 17/1/1994, No. 1/41/93RC-1/1597, dated 17-8-2005, No.1/41/93 RCI/209, dated 24.2.2009 and No.1/41/93 RCI/609 dated 24.10.2013 in the Section of prescribed proforma.
- 15.1.2 The BC Certificate in Performs other than the prescribed Performs will not be accepted. The candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to attach a declaration (as per Annexure-III) along with Backward Class certificate that no change occurred in their status and they do not fall in the section of creamy-layer as per Govt, letter No. 10/9/2009-RCI/62 Dated 08/1/2010.
- 15.1.3 The Competent Authorities to issue the necessary certificate are:
 - a) Deputy Commissioner
 - b) Additional Deputy Commissioner
 - c) Sub-Divisional Magistrate
 - d) Executive Magistrate (PCS Officers only)
 - e) Tehsildar

15.2 SON/DAUGHTER/GRAND SON/GRAND DAUGHTER OF FREEDOM FIGHTERS (PUNJAB)

- 15.2.1 Candidates claiming to be son/grandson/daughter/granddaughter of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate issued by the competent authority (i.e., Deputy Commissioner of the district concerned) as per Punjab Government Instructions No.9 (13) 3P-II-84/5822 dated 4/4/1985, No.1(135)-8P-II/7/310/20,dated 19.6.91 and No. 4-13-8 P-11-97/10112 dated 22/8/1997.
- 15.2.2 Only those Freedom Fighters and their son/daughter/grand-son/grand-daughter are eligible for consideration for reservation under this category who:
 - a) belong to the State of Punjab; and
 - have either been granted a Freedom Fighter pension by the Punjab Government or have been awarded Tamra Patra by the Government of India; or
 - c) are otherwise eligible for the grant of Freedom Fighter pension and Tamra Patra but for any reason whatsoever did not apply for Freedom Fighter pension and Tamra Patra but can obtain Freedom Fighter son/daughter/grandson/grand-daughter of Freedom Fighter certificate from the General Administration (Political wing) of the Punjab Government.

15.3 EX-SERVICEMEN (PUNJAB)

- 15.3.1 "Ex-serviceman" means a person who has served in any rank, whether as a combatant for a non combatant, in the Naval, Military and Air Force of the Union of India (here-in-after referred to as the Armed forces of the Union of India), and who has:
 - retired or released from such service at his or her own request after earning his or her pension; or
 - b) been released from such service on medical grounds attributable to military service or circumstances beyond his control and awarded medical or other disability pension; or
 - been released otherwise than on his own request from such service as a result of reduction in establishment; or
 - d) been released from such service after completing the specific period of engagement otherwise than at his own request or by way of dismissal or discharge on account of misconduct or ineffsciency and has been given a gratuity.

"But does not include a person who has served in the Defence Security Corps, the General Reserve Engineering Force, the Lok Sahayak Sena and the Para -Military Forces, but includes personnel of the Lok Sahayak Sena of the following categories namely:

- Pension holders for continuous embodied service
- b) Persons with disability attributable to military service; and
- Gallantry award winners
- 15.3.2 Ex-servicemen should be of Punjab domicile and they should submit a Punjab Resident Certificate from the competent authority, failing which would result in cancellation of their candidature.
- Explanation: The persons serving in the Armed Forces of the Union, who on retirement from service would come under the category of "Ex-servicemen", may be permitted to apply for re-employment one year before the completion of specified terms of engagement and avail themselves of all concessions available to Ex-servicemen but shall not be permitted to leave the uniform until they complete the specified terms of engagement in the Armed Forces of the Union.
 - 15.3.4 As per Punjab Govt. letter No.15/25/2001-4DW/1591 dated 21/5/2002 an Exserviceman is allowed the benefit of Reservation for the second time and even thereafter in subsequent recruitment in according with the provisions of these Rules.
 - 15.3.5 Provided that where an Ex-serviceman is not available for recruitment against a reserved category, such a vacancy shall be reserved to be filled in by recruitment of either the wife or one descendent child of an Ex-serviceman.
 - 15.3.6 Provided further that the wife or the Lineal Descendent child of the Exserviceman shall be recruited against the reserved vacancy subject to the conditions that:
 - he or she possesses the prescribed qualifications and the within the prescribed age limit,
 - (ii) he or she is not already in service;
 - (iii) he or she will be eligible to avail the benefit only once in life.

Provided further that one grand Child of the Gallantry Award Winner shall be recruited against the reserved vacancy, in case the benefit or reservation has not been availed of by any of the children or dependents such winner or by the winner himself subject to the conditions specified in the second proviso.

For the purpose off this proviso Gallantry Award Winner includes the winner of the Paramvir Chakra, The Mahavir Chakra, the Vir Chakra, the Sena or Nao Sena or Vayu Sena Medal and Mention-in-Despatches.

15.3.7 As per Punjab Government notification No.GSR9/Const./ Art309, 234 and 318/Amd(5)/2003 dated 06/11/2002 and letter No. 1/28/92-3ET/2805 dated 14/05/2003 and:

- a) "Lineal Descendent" means sons/daughters (married/un-married/widowed legally divorced) of the re-employed unemployed Ex-Serviceman.
- b) "Wife" shall include the widow of an Ex-serviceman, provided she has not re-married up to the date of the issue of the appointment letter."
 - c) In any case, including the case where the Ex-Serviceman has died, his sons/daughters shall be treated as "Lineal descendent" only if a certificate to this effect has been issued by the authorsty appointed by the Government.

15.3.8 Definition of War Hero:-

- (i) "War hero" means a defence services personnel or a para-military forces personnel, who is a bona fide resident of Punjab State and has been killed or discharged from service on account of disability suffered by him on or after 1st January, 1999, while fighting in war declared so by Government of India, in operations in Kargil or any other sector in J and K in the on-going conflict with Pakistan other operations which may be notified by the State Government to have been undertaken for preserving the unity and integrity of the Country; or
- (ii) A defence services personnel or a para-military forces personnel who was a bona fide resident of Punjab State and was posthumously decorated with Parmvir Chakra, Mahavir or Vir Chakra; provided that.—
- (a) In exceptional instances, the cases of such War Heroes may also be covered, with the prior approval of the Department of Personnel who though bona fide residents of Punjab State are closely connected to the State of Punjab.
- (b) In the case of War Heroes, falling in the category (II), the benefits to be given by the State Government will be restricted only to first generation dependent member/next of the kin. Note. The Government reserves the right to include any other category of Awardees for the purpose of providing employment to the category of War Heroes, as may be notified.

15.4 SPORTS PERSON (PUNJAB)

- 15.4.1 A candidate can claim reservation under the Sports Person category only if
 - a) He She belongs to State of Punjab; and
 - b) He She has won Gold, Silver or Bronze Medal in Senior National Championship or National Games in team or individual events while representing the State of Punjab in such sports events as have been conducted by such respective National Sports federations as are affiliated or recognized to the Indian Olympic Association:

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- c) He/She has won first, second or third position in team or individual events and or he/she won Gold or Silver or Bronze Medals at International Sports meets, conducted by Sports Federation affiliated or recognized by the International Olympic Committee or by the International Olympic Committee itself.
- 15.4.2 If candidate belongs to Sports Person, Punjab Category, an attested copy of Gradation Certificate strictly in accordance with the Punjab Sportsman Rules, 1988 as amended on 20.07.2020 issued by the competent authority should be attached with the application form.
- 15.4.3 Director Sports, Punjab is the competent authority to issue Sports Gradation Certificate and any other Sports Certificate issued by any other authority will not be accepted a valid Certificate for claim of reservation under the Sports Person, Punjab Category.
- 15.4.4 Applicants claiming reservation under Sports Person, Punjab Category must submit Resident Certificate from the competent authority, failing which would result in cancellation of their candidature.

15.5 SCHEDULED CASTE, (PUNJAB)/ SCHEDULED TRIBES

The competent authorities for issuing Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes certificates are:

- 15.5.1 District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ Ist Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/ Sub Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner (Not below the rank of Ist Class Stipendiary Magistrate);
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate;
- 15.5.3 Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar,
- 15.5.4 Sub Divisional Officer (C) of the area where the candidate and or his family formally resides:
- 15.5.5 Administrator/Secretary to Administrator/Development Officer Lakshadweep Islands.
- 15.5.6 As per para-3 of Punjab Govt. Instructions No. 1/8/2007-RC-1/815, dated 10th July, 2008, Head of Department or Head of Offices are competent to issue Scheduled Castes Certificates to those applicants whose parents are serving or residing in Chandigarh/Mohali on the basis of their parents service record.

15.6 WIDOWS AND CERTAIN OTHER CATEGORIES OF WOMEN

- 15.6.1 The definitions as per Government Instructions issued vide letter No. 1/50/83-5PP(1368)/3454 dated 23-4-84 as amended from time to time the widows and certain other categories of women for reservation in employment is as under: Widows:
- 15.6.2 Women who are legally separated from their husbands or have been divorced;
- 15.6.3 Women whose husbands have been ordered by Civil or Criminal Courts to pay maintenance to them:
- 15.6.4 Women whose husbands have remarried; and
- 15.6.5 Wives of serving military personnel or those who are disabled while in military

15.7 DISABLED PERSONS (PUNJAB) RULES FOR EXAMINATION:

As per the Instructions of Govt. of Punjab, Department of Social Security and Women and Child Development issued vide letter No. 1/1/2017-3DC/1588894/1 dated 03-10-2019, the reservation for Disable persons under Section 34 of the Right of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 is as under:

 For persons with disability compensatory time of 20 minutes per hour is allowed.

iv.

- Persons with disability who apply for scribe in a prescribed format is attached compensatory time of 20 minutes per hours is allowed.
- Scribe' is allowed to the following candidate, who applies under the category of Persons with Disability, Punjab.
 - Blind and low vision candidate as per instructions cited above in Para 15.7 above.
 - Such other disabilities due to which a candidates is not able to write.
 - (iii) The Scribe shall not have an academic qualification of more than 10+2 class.
- d) Persons with Disability candidates will submit the following documents to office of PPSC (Superintendent Examination) in person, by last date for online application forms i.e 31/01/2025 (for vetting), failing which they will not be provided the Scribe or given additional time. As per the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment Memorandum dated August 29, 2018, the Punjab Public Service Commission has formed a Panel of Scribes having qualification matriculation or above. The eligible candidates may request the PPSC for the scribe by 31/01/2025. On receipt of request from the candidate, the candidate will be allotted scribe by the PPSC and he she will be allowed to meet the scribe two day before the examination. However, if the candidate wants to bring his/her own scribe, the qualification of the scribe should be one step below the minimum qualification for the post. The candidate opting for his/her own scribe should submit an affidavit annexed as Annexure-IV.
 - i) Disability Certificate from office of the Civil Surgeon.
 - For the provision of a Scribe, Affidavit registered as per the specimen is attached.

15.8 Economically Weaker Section :

Residents of Punjab belonging of Economically Weaker Section (whose family income is less that Rs. 8.00 lac per annum) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes.

For this purpose "Family" will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his her parents, sibling below the age of 18 years, as also his her spouse and children below the age of 18 year.

"Income" will include all sources for the financial year prior to the year of application. Further a person will be excluded whose family owns possesses any of the following assets:

- 5 Agricultural Land and above
- ii) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above
- Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities/Nagar Panchatyat.
- Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in other than the notified municipalities/nagar Panchatyat.
- NOTE 1:- Recruitment of EWS category will be governed as per the notification Government of Punjab issued vide letter No 1/3/2019-RCI/196 dated 18/03/2021.
- NOTE 2: General Economically Weaker Section, Punjab (EWS) certificate based on the gross Family income for the Financial Year 2023-24 and Valid for Financial Year 2024-2025 only shall be considered valid.

APPENDIX-IV

THE SCHEDULE [See clause (zc) of section 2] SPECIFIED DISABILITY

Physical disability.—

- A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—
- (a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
- (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leptosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
- (b) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
- (c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
- (d) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
- (e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment-

- (a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—
 - (i) total absence of sight, or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
- (b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—
- (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200.
 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment -

- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- (b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- D. "speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.
- Intellectual disability, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- (b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusal or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.
- Mental behaviour.—

"mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by subnormality of intelligence.

- Disability caused due to---
 - (a) chronic neurological conditions, such as-
 - (i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
 - (ii) "parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
 - (b) Blood disorder-
 - (i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor would may result in fatal bleeding;
 - (ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
 - (iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.
 - Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
 - 6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

No. GS.R. 87/Const./Arts.389 and 15/2020, In exercise of the powers conferred by the provise to Article 309 read with clause (3) of Article 15 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Panjab is pleased to make the following rules far providing reservation in services for women in direct recruitment, numely:-

RULES

- Short title and commencement. (1) These rules may be called The Punjub Civil Services (Reservation of Posts for Women) Rules, 2020.
 - (2) These rules shall come into force on and with effect from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- 2. Definitions.- In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-
- (a) "establishment" means any office of the State Government, a local authority or a statotory authority constituted under any State Law for the time being in force, or a Board or Corporation in which not less than fifty-one per cent of the paid up share of capital is held by the Government of the State of Punjab and includes a university or college affiliated to the university, primary and secondary schools and other educational institutions, which are owned by the State Government and also includes an establishment in public sector; and
- (b) "establishment in public sector" means any industry, trade, business or accupation owned, controlled or managed by,-
 - (i) the State Government; and
 - (ii) Government Company as defined in sub-section (45) of section 2 of the Companies Act, 2013, in which not less than fifty-one per cent of the poid up share capital is held by the Government of the State of Punjab.
- 3. Scope and application.- Without prejudice to the generality of the

provisions contained in any Service rules, these rules shall apply to the filling up of posts by direct recruitment in all the establishments in Group 'A', Group 'B', Group 'C' and Group 'D' services.

- 4. Percentage and manner of reservation of posts.-(1) Notwithstanding unything contained in any Service rules, there shall be a thirty-three percent reservation, in favour of women, in all posts in Group 'A', Group 'B', Group 'C' and Group 'D' services under all the establishments at the stage of direct recruitment and this reservation shall be horizontal and compartmentalised.
 - (2) Where a vacancy is filled by direct recruitment by a woman on the basis of merit, then such woman candidate shall be appointed against the horizontal reservation for women within their respective vertical reservation in any category.

Explanation.

- (i) "Vertical reservation" means reservation in favour of the Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, Other Backward Classes and Economically Weaker Sections under classes (4) and (6) of Article 16 of the Constitution of India.
- (ii) For the purposes of this rule, "horizontal and compartmentalised reservation" means reservation within each watertight category, namely, Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, Other Backward Classes, Economically Weaker Sections and Open Category.
- Procedure for reservation of posts.- (1) The reservation of posts for women set out in rule 4 shall be applied in the following manner, namely:-
 - firstly, to fill the quota of the Open Category in order of merit and thereafter;
 - secondly, to fill up each of the vertical reservation quotas and thereafter;
 - thirdly, to find out how many women belonging to specific vertical reservation have been selected on the above basis and thereafter;
 - (iv) if the number of women candidates in each vertical is equal to or more than the thirty three percent reservation quota for women, then there shall be no further selection towards the reservation quota for women.
 - (2) Only if there is any shortfall of women candidates in a vertical

category, then the requisite number of women belonging to such vertical category shall have to be taken and adjusted or accommodated against their respective vertical reservation categories by deleting the corresponding number of candidates therefrom. This process of verification and adjustment or accommodation shall be applied separately to each of the vertical reservations. In such a case, the overall reservation of thirty-three percent in favour of women, may be satisfied or may not be satisfied.

(3) If the posts remain unfilled due to lack of sufficient number of eligible women candidates, then the unfilled posts shall not be carried forward to subsequent years and such posts shall be filled from the other candidates of the respective vertical categories.

Example -

if there are 200 vacancies and fifteen percent are reserved for Schedule Castes and twenty seven percent for Other Backward Classes under vertical reservation; and thirty three percent are reserved for women under horizontal reservation, then, there are 116 seats in Open Category, thirty seats for Schedule Castes and fifty four seats for Other Backward Classes under vertical reservation. Since, thirty three percent seats in each vertical is the reservation quota for women, i.e. thirty eight seats for Open Category women, ten seats for Schedule Caste women and eighteen seats for Other Backward Classes women.

Step 1.- Candidates shall have to be first listed in accordance with merit, from out of the successful eligible candidates, in their respective vertical categories.

Step 2.- As such, thirty posts are reserved for Schedule Castse (of which the quota for women is ten), Schedule Caste candidates shall have to be first listed in accordance with merit, from out of the successful eligible candidates. If such list of thirty candidates contains ten Schedule Caste women candidates, then there is no need to disturb the list by including any further Schedule Caste women candidates. On the other hand, if the list of thirty Schedule Caste candidates contains only eight women candidates, then the next two Schedule Caste women candidates in

accordance with merit, will have to be included in the list and corresponding number of candidates from the bottom of such list shall have to be deleted, so as to ensure that the final list of thirty selected Schedule Caste candidates contains ten women Schedule Caste candidates. But if the list of thirty Schedule Caste candidates contains more than ten women candidates, selected on own merit, all of them will continue in the list and there is no question of deleting the excess women candidates on the ground that Schedule Caste women have been selected in excess of the specified internal quota of ten.

Step 3.- Repeat this exercise for each vertical to fill vacancies.

It is clarified that if there is a shortfall of women in any watertight vertical category e.g. two Schedule Caste women (above) are not available in the list then,-

- the vacancy shall not be made available to women of any other vertical category i.e. Open Category Women or Other Backward Class women; and
- (ii) as such, the overall reservation of thirty three percent in favour of women, may be satisfied or may not be satisfied.
- Power to remove difficulties.- If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these rules, it shall be referred to the State Government in the Department of Personnel, whose decision thereon shall be final.

No. G.S.R. 40/Const./Art.309/Amd.(2)/2020.-In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Punjab is pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Punjab Recruitment of Sportsmen Rules, 1988 namely:-

RULES

- (1) These rules may be called the Punjab Recruitment of Sportsmen (First Amendment) Rules, 2020.
 - (2) They shall come into force on and with effect from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- In the Punjab Recruitment of Sportsmen Rules, 1988, in rule 2, in clause (d), for sub-clause (a), the following shall be substituted, namely :-
 - (a) In the case of recruitment to a reserved vacancy in Group A or Group B posts:
 - that he belongs to the State of Punjab; and (i)
 - that he has won Gold, Silver or Bronze Medal in Senior. National Championship or National Games in team or individual events while representing the State of Punjab in such sports events as have been conducted by such respective National Sports federations as are affiliated or recognized to the Indian Olympic Association;

that he has wen first, second or third position in team or individual events and/ or he has won Gold or Silver or Bronze Medals at International Sports meets, conducted by Sports Federation affiliated or recognized by the International Olympic Committee or by the International Olympic Committee Itself.
